- All range rules must be approved by PSAH Directors and Range CO-ORDINATOR
- All range designs and equipment must be approved by PSAH Directors and Range CO-ORDINATOR
- Any changes to range, equipment or rules, must be done in writing to PSAH Directors and Range CO-ORDINATOR
- Do not move range equipment, benches or target holders without approval of PSAH Directors and Range CO-ORDINATOR
- We are a Section 29 (2), (4) registered range (2008) Shoot only approved Firearms and targets
- Club "ID" must be worn
- **ALL range use and bookings must go through booking agent.**
- Anything to do with ATT's ---are the RESPONSIBILITY of the MEMBER
- Any range use, not written in Rules and Procedures MUST be okayed by PSAH Directors & Range CO-ORDINATOR

RANGE OPERATIONS

SECTION 1 – GENERAL:

- These Range Operating Instructions cover the use of the range facility operated by the Parry Sound Anglers & Hunters Inc. & Parry Sound Pistol Club.
- All Range Officers and range users are required to read and sign these Range Operating Instructions after any updates **
- Requests for exemptions from any provisions of the Range Operating Instructions shall be submitted in writing to PSAH and Range co-ordinator for approval.

SECTION 2 – RANGE FACILITY:

The range facility has multiple ranges. The description of the operational ranges is listed below:

- “A” Range – 25 yard handgun, small bore, rim-fire rifle & Action shooting
- “B” Range – five (5) position shotgun trap range
- “C” Range – 25/50/100 yard muzzle loading and all rifles ONLY **
- “D” Range - Special Use Range – handgun, rifle, muzzle loading, & shotgun
- “E” Range – Archery

<i>Approved Target:</i>	Frangible trap targets
<i>Approved Ammunition:</i>	1300 feet per second, # 7 ½ sized lead or steel

"C" RANGE

<i>Location:</i>	Immediately left of "B" range
<i>Description:</i>	25/50 & 100 yard rifle range ONLY
<i># of Firing Points:</i>	fourteen (14)
<i>Firing distances:</i>	25/50/100 yards
<i>Approved Firearms:</i>	Black powder and rifle, 25/50&100 yard ONLY No full automatics
<i>Maximum Calibres:</i>	338 Lapua magnum
<i>Approved Target:</i>	Paper targets
<i>Approved Ammunition:</i>	FMJ, SP, AND LEAD.

No incendiary, tracer or armour piercing bullets.

"D" RANGE

<i>Location:</i>	Below trap field – to right of 100 yard
<i>Description:</i>	50 yard
<i># of Firing Points:</i>	N/A
<i>Firing Distances:</i>	Maximum of 50 yards
<i>Approved Firearms:</i>	Hand gun, shotgun & rifle
<i>Maximum Calibres:</i>	45 ACP, 12 gauge, 54 black powder .
<i>Approved Target:</i>	Paper
<i>Approved Ammunition:</i>	FMJ, SP, LEAD, SHOT AND SLUGS.

No incendiary, tracer or armour piercing bullets.

“E” RANGE

<i>Location:</i>	Immediately left of “C” range
<i>Description:</i>	Archery
<i>Targets</i>	No metal targets – club approved targets**

SECTION 3 – PERSONNEL**1. RANGE OFFICER:**

The Range Officer has complete authority on the range property to conduct authorized shooting practices and matches.

The R.O. has the responsibility to supervise all persons (shooting and non-shooting alike) present on that range and may have members and/or non-members removed at his/her discretion. **

All R.O.’s operating the facility must have a valid Range Officer certification from a recognized agency. Parry Sound Anglers & Hunters recognizes R.O. qualifications from the following agencies or groups:

- C S S A
- SFC
- IPSC
- RCMP (Range Master course)
- Canadian Armed Forces Range Safety Officer Training
- DFO, Ports Canada Police, DNR or MNR
- Any other individual whose equivalent qualifications are deemed acceptable by the Club Executive and have taken Range Orientation Course and CLUB range officer course

2. GUESTS AND SPECTATORS:

Guests (children and adults) or pets are the responsibility of the Parry Sound Anglers & Hunter member who they came with and must remain under adult control at all times.

Spectators are the responsibility of the R.O. He/she must take personal responsibility for them or delegate that responsibility to someone else, preferably a Parry Sound Anglers & Hunter member.

SECTION 4 – RANGE OPERATIONS:

1. FLAGS:

A **RED** flag **MUST** be flown from the flag pole at the main entrance when firing is being conducted on any range within the facility. Each range has specific flag(s), which must be flown when in use. They are:

“A” Range

- **DROP SIGN AT RANGE DOOR**
- RED hand flag- out side range
- RED flag at active firing line, GREEN flag when firing has ceased

“B” Range

- DROP SIGNS Range In use
- RED flag at active firing line, GREEN flag when firing has ceased
- RED flag at end of safety fence

“C” Range

- RED HAND FLAGS & RANGE USE SIGN
- RED flag at active firing line, GREEN flag when firing has ceased
- RED flag on flag pole downrange

“D” Range

- RED flag on flag pole
- RED hand flag at active firing line GREEN hand flag or no flag when range not in use

“E” Range

- RED on flag at Gate
- RED flag at LEFT SIDE SAFTEY FENCE, C RANGE – no flag when range not in use
- Drop sign. At REAR corner of C range

2. TARGETS:

“A” Range - Paper

“B” Range - Frangible clay/trap targets

“C” Range - Paper

“D” Range - Paper

“E” Range - Non metallic

SAFE SHOOTING IS NO ACCIDENT

AT NO TIME CAN GLASS, POP CANS, WOOD, PLASTIC OR SIMILAR TARGETS BE USED ON THE RANGE FACILITY! ONLY APPROVED TARGETS.

3. LOG BOOK:

_ CLUB "ID" MUST BE WORN

ALL Members and Guests MUST sign log book at the appropriate range, prior to using any Range.!!!!!!!

ALL Guests MUST fill out "Guest Form" located beside the Log Book on each range**

ALL members and guests MUST display name tags when on Range.

IT IS THE RO'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT EVERYONE SIGNS IN

.4. AMMUNITION:

All spent cartridge cases or shot shell hulls must be collected and disposed in containers provided or removed from the range.

Any misfire casings must be removed from range by shooter or placed in appropriate container.

The use of tracer, incendiary, explosive or similar ammunition is prohibited.

Only authorized calibers and types of ammunition may be used on any range

5. FIRING:

The following firing guidelines are applicable to all outdoor ranges on the complex:

- No firing before 7 a.m. (9 a.m. Sunday) and no firing 10 minutes after sunset., 11PM. INSIDE RANGE A1. (with lights ON)
- Shooting alone is NOT recommended
- No firing if target visibility is reduced as determined by the R.O.
- Shooters with loaded firearms must be under R.O. direction.
Firearms shall never be left unattended. (unlocked)
Lone shooters must act as the R.O.

6. **FIREARM TYPE APPROVALS** (by range):

The following firearms types are approved for use on the range as indicated:

“A” Range – Pellet , Centre-fire and rim-fire cartridge handguns ,Pellet, rim-fire cartridge rifles, Muzzle loading and/or black powder handguns out side only

“B” Range – Shotguns only

“C” Range – Pellet , Centre-fire and rim-fire cartridge rifles ,muzzle loading rifles and black power pistol on 25yd.range

“D” Range – Centre-fire and rim-fire caliber hand guns, rim-fire caliber rifles, shotguns

“E” Range – Archery

7. **EXPLOSIVES:**

The detonation of explosive target devices is prohibited on the range property.

8. **FIREARMS INSPECTION AREA:**

“A” Range – Inspection area is located in Pistol Club House (safe area)

“B” Range – Inspection area is a four (4) sided wooden table behind trap firing stations

“C” Range - Inspection area inside range entrance door

“D” Range - Inspection area at safety bench

“E” Ranges – Inspection area at safety bench

9. **HUNTING:**

No hunting allowed on property.

10. **SAFETY ZONES:**

Each range has a safety (danger) area designed for specific firearms and calibers. These areas are out of bounds (no trespassing) areas designed to contain overshoot and ricocheting

bullets. Every reasonable effort shall be extended by the R.O. to ensure that the safety area does not have people in it during range operations.

11. **GARBAGE:**

All garbage (including empty casings) must be collected, bagged and removed (NOT BURNED) from property. Transfer Station is next door.**

12. **HANDGUNS:**

--All handguns must be In Cased and Trigger locked. except while on an **active** firing line , while in the inspection area or ACTION shooters (to and from, A and D)

13. **MATCH COMPLETION:**

At the conclusion of all matches or practices the R.O. will ensure that:

- All targets are removed.
- Firing points are policed for brass and other debris.
- All flags are lowered and caution signs closed.
- Buildings and entrance gates are closed and locked.

The R.O. will inspect the range prior to a match as well as at match completion and report all noted deficiencies in Log Book in club house.

SECTION 5 – RANGE SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

1-

1. *No Vehicles On Range*
2. *Ranges B D and C. Only One range Maybe Used At A Time.*
3. *New Gun ,Sights or Scope MUST. Start at 25 yd Range*
4. *Range C Check for any individuals behind 50 yd berm ***
5. *If range maintenance Sign is in place at gate . ALL RANGES ARE CLOSED.*

SPECTATORS:

Spectators will follow all directions given to them by the R.O. Spectators must remain 5 meters behind any active firing line.

Hearing and eye protection should be worn by spectators.

SAFE SHOOTING IS NO ACCIDENT

3. **HEARING AND EYE PROTECTION:**

Hearing protection for shooters and range staff in near proximity to an active firing line is **MANDATORY**. 26 dB or better

Eye protection for shooters and range staff in near proximity to an active firing line is **MANDATORY**.. CSA approved with side protection

4. **ALCOHOL/DRUGS:**

Any person deemed to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs will **NOT** be permitted to shoot

5. **SMOKING**

Due to the extreme fire hazard in the range area, smoking is **NOT PERMITTED** in wooded areas.

Smoking is **NOT** permitted on any firing line or in any building.

Directions: Brooks Road west to Oastler Park Drive north. North to Bowes Street then west 2 kms. on Bowes Street to Albert Street then south to hospital. Travel time approximately 10 minutes

THERE MUST BE A RANGE SAFETY OFFICER PRESENT WHEN ANY RANGE IS IN USE

RANGE SAFETY OFFICER DUTIES:

- Must have passed Range Officer course or completed Range Orientation Course
- Range Officers must identify themselves with hat, vest, armband
- Make sure Range and shooting stations are safe:
 - Sign-in book and guest sheets must be filled in by everyone
 - Flags, light and drop signs
 - Firearms racked and handled safely
- Check that shooters have had Range Orientation Course
 - That shooters know Range Rules
 - That shooters FOLLOW Range Rules
 - Act in a safe manner
- That Eye and Ear protection is worn
- Give all commands – make safe, load and firing.
- Report any deficiencies and accidents in Log Book, file accident forms (in Red Binder)** and notify Range co-ordinator or President immediately.
- OPP must be notified immediately of any accident caused by discharge of a firearm.
- The Shooting Range – Personal Injury Report form (in Red Binder) must be filled out immediately and given to the Range Co-ordinator or the President**
- Flags, Lights, Signs – “Red” Range in Use “Green” Range is Safe
- When using Ranges “B” “C” “D”, check behind 50 yd. Berm.
- Follow specific Range Rules depending on what Range You Are Using.

SAFE SHOOTING IS NO ACCIDENT

- **Ensure that ranges garbage, targets and used brass are cleaned up.**

PARRY SOUND PISTOL CLUB HOLSTER & ACTION SHOOTING RULES

1. **No** use of holster by any member unless during designated Action Shooting Events **and** under direct (ACTION) Safety Officer supervision.
2. All participants must have completed a qualification course approved by the PSPC and have received approval to participate by the PSPC by completing a PSPC orientation specifically designated for participation in Action Shooting.
3. Fire arms **always unloaded**, unless under direction of safety officer.
4. No firearm may be handled unless the shooter is either on a live firing line or at a designated “Safe Handling Bench.”
5. At no time is ammunition to be present at a “Safe Handling Bench.”
6. Range “A” – the left side Berm is restricted to 15 meters or less. No targets placed on range floor. All bullets must impact the backstop at middle or lower without striking range floor. All targets are to be placed as close to backstop as practical. No shooting greater than 45 degrees from the firing line to backstop or side backstop.
7. Range “D” – No targets placed on range floor. All bullets must impact the backstop at middle or lower without striking range floor. All targets are to be placed as close to backstop as practical. No shooting greater than 90 degrees from the firing line to backstop.
8. All steel targets must be shrouded for competition use or bunkered for regular day to day use. At 10m or more

At no time may a loaded magazine or speed loader be handled at the “Safe Handling Bench”

25 YARD RANGE RULES (INSIDE) – RANGE “A” – 1

HAND GUNS, PELLET & RIM FIRE RIFLES ONLY

HOURS OF OPERATION: 7 a.m. – 11 p.m. (9 a.m. on Sunday)

RANGE PROCEDURES:

1. Drop sign at gate to read “Range in Use”.
2. Raise RED flag at Gate.
3. Drop “Range in Use” sign at gate to Range A.
4. Lock outside gate.
5. Everyone must sign “Log Book” in Club House.
6. Guests must fill out “Guest Form” located by Log Book.
7. CLUB “ID” MUST BE WORN
8. No full auto “ or altered fire arms

RANGE “A” – 1 RULES:

- EYE AND EAR PROTECTION MUST BE USED.
- Ear Protection should be used in Pistol building.
- Coming to and from the firing line, firearms are to be SAFE FOR TRANSPORTATION.
- When range is active, doors to firing line MUST be **CLOSED & LOCKED**.
- Indoor firing line may only shoot at 25 yards only.
- Shoot only CLUB APPROVED targets.
- If more than one (1) shooter, one must act as Range Officer.
- If three (3) shooters on line, Range Officer CANNOT SHOOT.
- All shooters must obey all Range Rules and follow Range Officer Commands.
- Furnace fan should be turned on (winter); open windows (summer) for Air Quality.
- No Black Powder.
- FOLLOW ACTION SHOOTING RULES
- **HANDGUN SHOOTERS ARE EITHER BENCH SHOOTERS OR ACTION SHOOTERS & MUST FOLLOW APPROPRIATE RULES**

25 YARD RANGE RULES (OUTSIDE) RANGE "A" - 2

HAND GUNS & RIM FIRE RIFLES ONLY

HOURS OF OPERATION: 7 a.m. – 11 p.m. (9 a.m. on Sunday)

RANGE PROCEDURES:

1. Drop sign at gate to read "Range in Use".
2. Raise RED flag at Gate..
3. Drop "Range in Use" sign at door to Range A.
4. Everyone must sign Log Book in Club House.
5. Guests must fill out "Guest Form" located by Log Book.
6. No full auto or altered fire arms
7. **CLUB " ID " MUST BE WORN**

RANGE "A"2- RULES:

OUTSIDE RANGE IS FOR ACTION and 3 GUN SHOOTING

CLUB and ACTION SHOOT RULES MUST BE FOLLOWED AT ALL TIMES

- EYE AND EAR PROTECTION MUST BE USED.
- When range is in use – ASK before entering.
- Coming to and from the firing line, firearms are to be SAFE . Firearms should NOT be HANDLED or PREPARED for firing EXCEPT AT THE FIRING LINE or in the SAFE AREA inside pistol building.
- Shoot only CLUB APPROVED targets on target holders erected and approved by club/range
- .
- MUST ALWAYS BE A " ACTION CERTEFIED" "Range Officer".
- Firearms must NEVER be left Unattended.
- Targets must be as close to berm as possible (less than 1 foot)
- ALL SHOOTERS MUST OBEY ALL RANGE RULES!
- FOLLOW ACTION SHOOTING RULES
- **NO STEEL (TARGET HOLDERS) ON RANGE**

TRAP RANGE RULES – RANGE “B”

HOURS OF OPERATION: 9 a.m. to 10 minutes after sunset

RANGE PROCEDURES:

1. Drop sign at gate to read “Range in Use”.
2. Raise RED flag at Gate.
3. Drop “Range in Use” signs at gate to trap range (Range B). Red flag at end of fence
4. Everyone must sign Log Book in Club House. or At B Range
5. Guests must fill out “Guest Form” located by Log Book
- 6 Red or Green flag at range. flag pole
- 7 CLUB “ ID “ MUST BE WORN
- 8 HAND THROWERS MUST NOT BE USED

TRAP RULES:

- EYE AND EAR PROTECTION IS MANDATORY.
- There Must Always Be A Club Approved RANGE OFFICER.
- The range officer shall give all commands: LINE IS READY , LINE IS CLEAR & CEASE FIRE.
- The range officer shall be responsible for ensuring all firearms are unloaded during a ‘CEASE-FIRE” and no firearms are handled while any person is “DOWN RANGE”. Under GREEN Flag
- Coming to and from the firing line, firearms are to be unloaded and clear of ammunition.
- Firearms MUST NOT be HANDLED or PREPARED for firing EXCEPT at the “FIRING LINE”. Under RED flag.
- First shooter may load, only after red flag is up and Range Officer gives the “Ready” command.
- Load only one round in shotgun (2 for doubles) AT YOUR TURN ONLY.
- Wait till after next shooter has fired , before discarding spent cartridge
- No person shall approach the Firing Line when it is “ACTIVE” and RED FLAG is up
- Red flag—Range is Active.
- When GREEN flag is up, all firearms must be unloaded and BENCHED OR RACKED
- Firearms must be uncased at Safe Bench. And racked (NO AMMUNITION)_
- AMMUNITION and Supplies, to be placed on Range Equipment bench
- R/O Will make up shooting order on score sheet.
- Club thrower may ONLY be used by designated Trap R/O or Trap director..
- BARREL MUST BE 26” or MORE

SAFE SHOOTING IS NO ACCIDENT

RANGE "C" 25/50/100 yd.

HOURS OF OPERATION: 9 a.m. – 10 minutes after sunset

RANGE PROCEDURES:

1. Drop sign at gate to read "Range in Use".
2. Raise RED flag at Gate...
3. Raise RED flag at Range "C". flag pole
4. **Everyone must sign Log Book AT RANGE 'c'**
5. Guests must fill out "Guest Form" located by Log Book.
6. **Must Always Be A Range Officer**
7. **CLUB " ID " MUST BE WORN**

RANGE "C" RULES: 25/50/100 yd. RIFLE ONLY

- Range "C"- can ONLY be used when, D Range, and B Trap Range are not in use.
- EYE AND EAR PROTECTION MUST BE USED.
- Hand flags MUST...be used; RED – Live Range; GREEN – Safe, and turn sign used
- Shoot only CLUB APPROVED targets in approved target holders for all ranges!
- **If more than one (1) shooter, one must act as Range Officer.**
- Range Officer shall give all commands and be responsible for insuring all firearms are unloaded during a cease fire and NO firearms are handled when any person is down range.
- Firearms will ABSOLUTELY NOT be handled or prepared for firing EXCEPT under RED flag and the READY command.**
- Shooters may load ONLY after RED flag goes up and Range Officer gives the READY command.
- No person shall approach the firing line when it is in ACTION.
- When GREEN flag is up all firearms must be UNLOADED , BOLT REMOVED, EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATOR IN, BENCHED OR RACKED
- Vehicles must be parked in PARKING AREA – NOT ON RANGE!
- Field Entrance Gate MUST be locked at all times
- Sighting In New Gun, Sights, or Scope. Must Start At 25 yd Range
- Firearms must never be left UNATTENDED...OR UN-LOCKED
- **No shot guns or hand guns****

RANGE "D" - SPECIAL USE RANGE

HOURS OF OPERATION: 7 a.m. – 11 p.m. (9 a.m. Sunday)

CLUB "ID" MUST BE WORN

RANGE PROCEDURES:

1. Drop sign at gate to read "Range in Use".
2. Raise RED flag at Gate.
3. Raise RED flag at Range "D"
4. All shooters must sign in at Range
5. Range Officer must sign Log Book at "D" Range before each shoot.(Special Use)**
6. Supply a copy of "Course of Fire" before shooting. (special use)
7. One of Club's Range Officers may attend each shoot.
8. CLUB "ID" MUST BE WORN

RANGE RULES:

- **NO HAND THROWERS ON RANGE!!!****
- We are a Section 29 (2), (4) Registered Range (2008).
- No prohibited "full automatic" Firearms.
- Ensure that no projectiles discharged leave the range.
- Shoot ONLY firearms and course of fire that range is approved for.
- No incendiary, tracer or armour piercing bullet designs.
- EYE and HEARING PROTECTION IS MANDATORY.
- ***** No prone shooting "closer than" 15 Yards *****
- Targets MUST be placed near to the berm, below centre and 1 foot off range floor. MUST shoot paper targets ONLY.
- No Vehicles on Range
- May use all Open "D" Range (including 100 yd. target holders)
- All garbage (including casings) is to be collected, bagged and removed from the Range property. Transfer station is next door.**
- At completion of event, lower all flags, lock building and gates.
- There MUST be a Range Officer present.
- Shooting alone is NOT recommended
- Range Officer MUST report all deficiencies (in log book) and accidents in Red Binder**
- New accident forms and phone numbers located in Club House**.
- OBEY ALL CLUB RULES!
- Field entrance gate must be locked.
- **HANDGUN SHOOTERS ARE EITHER BENCH SHOOTERS OR ACTION SHOOTERS & MUST FOLLOW APPROPRIATE RULES 50 YD. MAX**
- **NO STEEL ON RANGE .. TARGET OR PROP HOLDERS**
- **NO EXPLODING TARGETS**
- **Action and 3 gun shooters must follow Action Shooting Rules.**

ARCHERY RANGE "E"

HOURS OF OPERATION: 9 a.m. – 10 minutes after sunset.

RANGE PROCEDURES:

1. Drop sign at gate to read "Range in Use".
2. Raise RED flag at Gate..
3. Display Archery sign and place Archery tag on gate lock
4. Everyone must sign Log Book in TIN shed under tower (on door)
5. Guests must fill out "Guest Form" by Log Book.
6. Drop sign at corner of C range and RED flag on side fence of C range.
- 6 CLUB " ID " MUST BE WORN
- 7 Accident forms and guest forms in Red Binder in shed.

ARCHERY RANGE RULES:

- Archery Range ("E") can ONLY be used when D Range and B Trap Range are NOT in use.
- Shoot only CLUB APPROVED Targets on Club Target holders
- Obey Range Safety Rules (there are nearby neighbours).
- Vehicles must be parked in Parking Area – NOT ON RANGE.
- NO BROAD HEAD ARROWS
- CROSS BOWS ARE PERMITTED (at a safe distance to target)

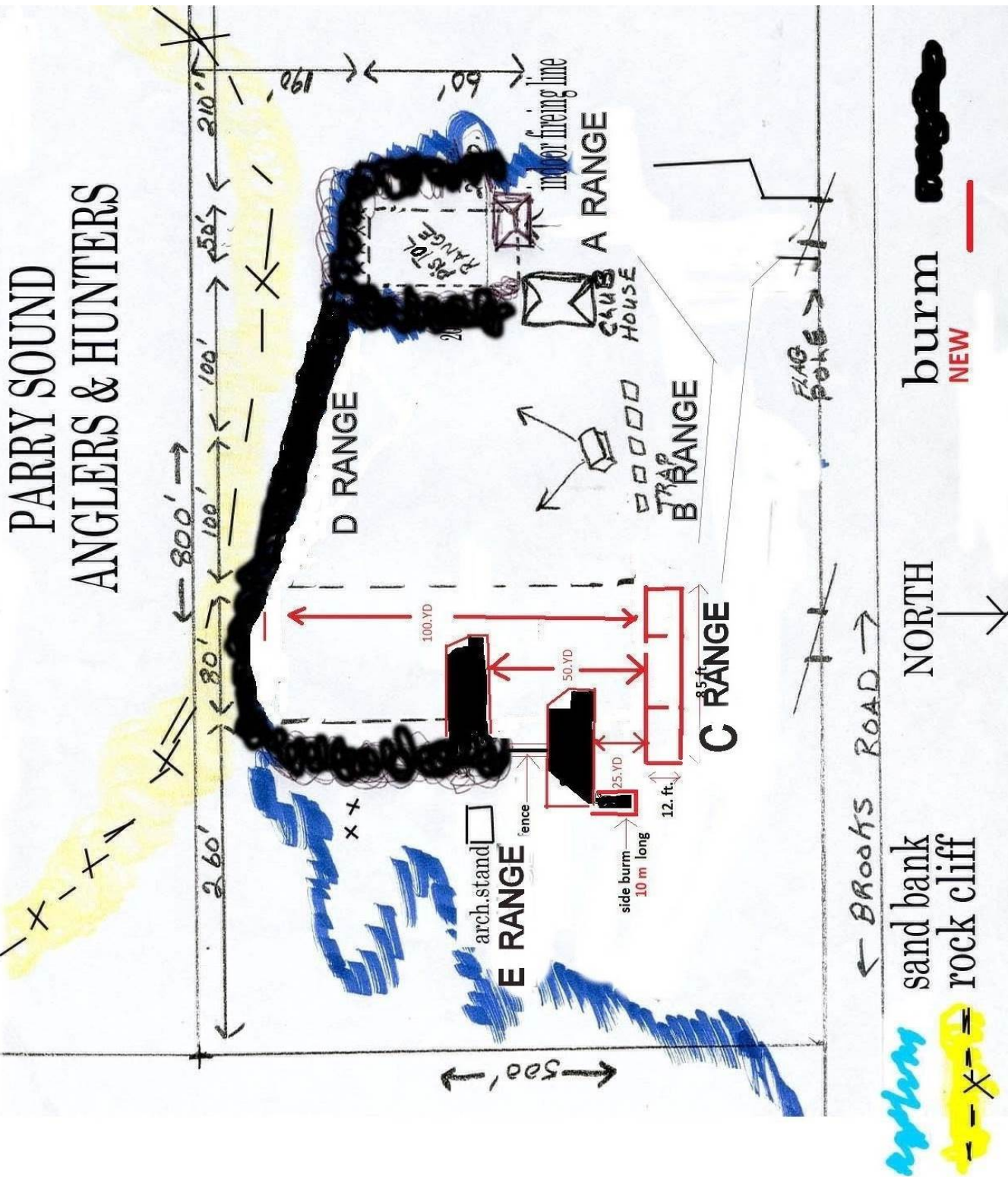

- 7- Use Hearing Protection . (26 dB. or Better)
- 8- Clean Up Brass, Targets and Garbage. Take any
Food garbage with you! If Garbage bag is full,
replace and drop off at transfer station next door.
- 9- Sighting In New Gun, sights or Scope Always
Start On 25 yd. Range
- 10- Sign Out, Drop Flags, Close Signs And Lock
Gate.
- 11- Range maintenance workers..
Maintenance Sign placed at Gate
